**Phonics**



Monday	<p>Watch the speed sound session with Miss Innes on the website.</p> <p>You will need you letter sound cards from your home learning pack. Look around your house for different objects e.g. toy car, teddy, fork, spoon, bowl, book, pen, duck etc.</p> <p>Place the objects on the floor. Firstly, group any objects that begin with the same letter together. Now put out the letter sounds from your pack in front of you. Match the sound to the objects. For example, b letter card would match with bowl. Have a go at writing down the objects you have found.</p>

You could also create a bingo card with eight boxes – each one containing a letter. Put the flashcards into a pile, facing down and take it in turns to be the bingo caller.</p>	



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Monday	<p><u>Investigating shadows</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Decide what type of puppets you want. How about your favourite animal? Or your friends and family? Or a scary ghost?</li> <li>2. Draw outlines for your puppets on paper or card.</li> <li>3. Put the lamp on the floor or on a table. Point it at the wall and turn it on. Turn off other lights and close the curtains.</li> <li>4. Hold your puppets between the light and the wall. Can you see a shadow on the wall? Move the puppets between the light and the wall to make the shadow different sizes.</li> </ol>	Watch Mrs Pfupa show you how to do this.
Tuesday	Listen to the story 'The Dot' read by Miss Innes. Vashti thought she was unable to draw but she started with a dot and then her dots transformed in to beautiful art work. Can you make a picture of dots? Start with one and see where it takes you...	Video of Miss Innes reading 'The Dot'
Wednesday	<p><u>Maps</u></p> <p>Tomorrow you will be drawing a map of your journey to school. Today we would like you to walk the journey for your daily exercise and record the things you see along the way. This can be done by taking photographs, drawing pictures or writing things down. For example, traffic lights, police station, shops, car garage, path etc.</p>	
Thursday	<p><u>Maps</u></p> <p>Draw a map of your journey to school using your pictures/ photos/ notes from yesterday.</p>	
Friday	<p><b>Rainbow skittle experiment.</b></p> <p>You will need plate or bowl, water, skittles.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Place your Skittles in a circle around your dish. You could try doing this in different shapes to see what happens. We just tried it by doing a circle.</li> <li>2. Once you have completed the circle add in medium temperature water in the middle. Make sure you</li> </ol>	



	<p>add enough to go right to the edge of the candy on both sides.</p> <p>3. Wait thirty seconds to see the colours begin to come out. The colour will start dissolving away from the shell once you add in the warm water. Then be completely amazed by your beautiful results! At the end, you can have your child mix all the colours together using a toothpick or their finger. You can discuss how when you mix colours together it becomes a brownish colour.</p>
