Can you find some evidence to support your ideas?</p>	<p>On YouTube, put on a crackling fire and snuggle up with your favourite books. Drink a hot chocolate and share a book with someone for 20 minutes.</p> 	<p>Book Potato Characters Can you recreate one of the characters from the story by making a potato character?</p>	<p>Animate Create your own animation of a hot air balloon in flight. You could use 2animate on Purple Mash or create your own flipbook using paper instead.</p>
<p>Postcard Write a postcard as if you are Peter writing to his friends back in East Germany that he has left behind. Think about what he might want to tell them about his adventure.</p>	<p>Word it Out Head over to https://worditout.com/ and create your own wordle by filling it with reasons why reading is important to you. Take a picture of your creation and send it to us on email.</p>	<p>Book Poster Can you create a poster advertising the book? Use illustrations that suit the book.
