


Year 3- Sirius

Core Subjects Learning:

Spelling

The focus will be to spell the Year 3 common exception words. They are not words for which phonics 'doesn't work', but they may be exceptions to spelling rules. We will be also be revisiting the spelling rules we have looked at throughout Year 3.

Reading

Our focus for Reading is to understand what we read by drawing inferences and using the text to justify our answers. We are also going to look at identifying main ideas drawn from within one paragraph and summarise these.

Literacy

The focus will be on reading and writing instructions for different purposes, We will use the taught features to improve our instructions and ensure we are meeting our target audience and purpose. As well as this, we will be writing a persuasive piece of work.

Maths

The focus will be on using multiplication facts for the 3, 4 and 8 times tables, calculating 2-digit numbers times 1-digit numbers, progressing to a formal method. We will also be looking closely at 2-D and 3-D shapes, drawing and making these using modelling materials.

Creative Learning:

We will tuck in and enjoy a yummy journey of discovery, tasting fantastic fruits, venerable vegetables and tantalizing treats. We will work up an appetite with delicious stories about food, have fun with a vegetable orchestra or become a fruity sculptor. Few will find exciting recipes to read - and write our own, too.
